


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Make the learning permanent through having your own content repository

Google Keep simplifies your workflow


Rather than divide your notes into notebooks, the organization in Google Keep comes down to just two simple things: labels (tags) and colors.

Communication

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Connect Frequently - in a variety of ways Succinct - Clarity of Vision - Be Consistent

- 1. Provide a good weekly overview to students and families.
- 2. Make it clear what needs to be completed and how it will be assessed.
- 3. Make sure learning support persons have access to materials to help at home.
- 4. Focus on customer service timely responses and contact.
- 5. Take away stress when and where possible.





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Reset Emergency Remote Learning Practices: Parents are Not Ok

Bryan Setser April 9, 2020

"You've announced emergency remote learning, and we're seeing the poor planning every day and every night in our homes."

"What parents need is clear, consistent, and supportive communications on what schools are trying to accomplish each week."

"Through it all, education leaders need to understand that the parent lift is far different than what it was with a couple of nights of homework and/or an evening to check assignments."

"The Pretty Plan"

Response Phases	School Activities
Phase 1 BASIC ACCESS	 ✓ Delivering food to children ✓ Getting computing devices and Internet hotspots to families ✓ Attending to basic student and family social, emotional, and health needs
Phase 2 SUBSISTENCE LEARNING	Rapid teacher training in basic learning technologies and online platforms Lower-level knowledge work for students (worksheet- and homework-like activities) Delivering papers and packets to families who don't have technology access
Phase 3 DEEPER LEARNING	 ✓ Designing instruction for higher-level learning, not just recall and regurgitation ✓ Designing instruction for greater student agency, interactivity, and authenticity ✓ Experimenting with teaching modalities because testing mandates have been removed
Phase 4 LOOKING AHEAD	 ✓ Paying greater attention in future to learning equity and digital equity concerns ✓ Designing future learning and teaching opportunities based on new skills gained ✓ Being better prepared for future dislocations of schooling

It is only when they are provided the knowledge, skills, resources, and support that [teachers] will integrate technology in the curriculum to maximize its effects on teaching and learning (Papanastasiou, Zemblyas, & Vrasidas, 2003)


